

Jon was commissioned as a combat engineer officer in 1965 and served as a platoon leader at Fort Carson, CO for a year where he taught the use of military explosives. He continued his service in Vietnam where he led his platoon in combat until 1967. In April of that year he returned to Wisconsin to become the Park Superintendent at High Cliff State Park which is located on the northeast corner of Lake Winnebago. In addition to his park superintendent responsibilities Jon was a Special Conservation Warden. He maintained those credentials for more than 20 years until he transferred

to the central office in Madison.

Jon and Bev lived in the park for seven of the ten years that he was the superintendent and lived the last three years in Menasha. By then they had three children (Scot, Sean and Sheila), and Bev was working as an RN in Neenah.


